# YHC Advocates on Behalf of Residents in Washington, D.C.

Last week, the members of the Ypsilanti Housing Commission Board of Commissioners and YHC staff traveled to Washington, D.C to participate in the National Association for Housing and Redevelopment Officials (NAHRO) Legislative Conference. Housing officials from all over the county gathered in D.C. to speak with our elected officials about the challenges affordable housing providers face.

The YHC took full advantage of this opportunity as we met with the offices of U.S. Representative Debbie Dingell, U.S. Senator Debbie Stabenow, and U.S. Senator Gary Peters. Not only did we discuss the support we need on a national level, but we discussed issues that are directly tied to YHC communities. We advocated for resources that would allow FEP to provide additional supportive services to our residents, and we also asked for support in the YHCs efforts at combating community violence.

"The YHC is committed to providing affordable, safe, and high-quality housing opportunities where residents have access to services and resources that allow them to reach their full potential."




# Project Decoded - An Introduction to Video Game Design



Project Decoded allows youth between the ages of 12 -18 to explore the world of video game design. In collaboration with Code 313, instructors provide one-on-one instruction to youth in various areas of video game design, including coding, gaming engines, game design, and so much more. After participants complete the first half of the daily programming, they get to have some fun playing video games on the provided systems, including Virtual Reality (VR), Nintendo Switch, PS5, and XBOX.

Project Decoded is held across the YHC communities twice a week, and transportation is provided. This is not only an opportunity for youth to explore video game design, but also serves as an introduction to the endless opportunities in the tech industry.

# **Family Empowerment Program**

# What is the Family Empowerment Program?

The Family Empowerment program was created to provide individuals and families of the YHC with Individualized Supportive Services, which is done by working with our residents to promote self-sufficiency in three key areas - employment, education, and health/wellness.

# What can the FEP help with?

FEP staff have varying focus areas, ranging from mental health coordination, education and wellness, senior support, and permanent supportive housing. Available services are quite varied: FEP hosts 6 food pantries a month (Sauk Trail, Hollow Creek, Towner), provides GED courses, afterschool tutoring, transportation, game nights, community events, case management, mental health counseling, financial literacy, and referrals for furniture, home essentials, car repair, assistance with DTE bills, and much more.

# Who should I contact for support?

Each YHC community has FEP staff present. Listed below are the staff members in each community. In the event of a crisis, we encourage residents to contact any available FEP staff member in addition to appropriate first responders (EMT, fire department, police department, etc...).

# **Resident Council General Information**

# **Resident Council Board of Directors:**

To serve as a resident council Board Member, residents must be elected by fellow resident council members. The Role of a Resident Council Board is to act officially as a liaison between the YHC and Resident Council. The Board will be Responsible for Holding resident Council Meetings, Setting Agendas, Voting on Matters, and Communicating the resident Council needs and concerns to Property Management and the YHC.

# **Resident Council Member:**

Every resident who resides in the community over 18 and on a residential lease is automatically a part of the resident Council. There will be monthly resident council meetings, where residents can come together and discuss various ways to improve their communities. All residents who qualify are encouraged to partake in the resident council meeting as this is a way to be a leader, advocate for resources for your community, and help your family and neighbors enjoy a higher quality of life.

# **Benefits of Resident Council to Residents**

- Makes a stronger and safer Community to live in.
- Makes decisions that affect you.
- Serves as a Voice for the residents.
- Represents the interest of all residents.
- Can link the resident to other resources around the community.
- Provides a means in which tenants' concerns can be prioritized and addressed.
- Can address concerns for residents with the YHC staff.
- Helps to educate and inform residents of grievances and other issues or projects on the property to keep residents up to date on that process.
- Provides a place where issues can be discussed and information distributed.
- Provides a way to organize projects and programs.
- Serves as a communication link to advocate the issues and concerns of residents.
- Support and promote programs and services, including applying for and receiving grants.
- Help builds a positive relationship with the YHC, businesses, churches, and other community organizations.

# Strong Future Resident Council Time Line

April 3rd - April 14th - Residents can submit nominations for themselves or nominate others to run for the Strong Future Resident Council Board of Directors. During this period, election workers will reach out to nominated residents and identify those who would like to accept their nominations.

April 17th - May 12th - A 30-day campaign window will open and during this time residents who accepted their nomination can ask their fellow Strong Future residents to vote for them.

May 15th - June 2nd - The election periods starts on May 15th and all Strong Future residents will be provided with a ballot. The last day residents will be able to submit a ballot is June 2nd.

June 9th - The winners of the Strong Future Resident Council Board of Directors will be revealed.

If you are a resident of Strong Future (Towner, Hollow Creek, Sauk Trail, or the Scattered Sites) and are interested or know someone who would make a strong candidate to serve on the Strong Future Resident Council Board of Directors, please see the attached flyer and review the directions on how to submit a nomination.
