Help Protect the Healthy Michigan Plan (HMP)

Affordable health care keeps Michigan families **healthy** and provides **peace of mind**. Thanks to the Healthy Michigan Plan (HMP) Medicaid expansion, more Michigan residents than ever have access to the care they need.

However, the state is making changes the eligibility rules for HMP to add work requirements for adults who receive Medicaid through the expansion. Starting January 1, 2020, these individuals would need to prove that they are working or participating in a qualifying activity for at least 80 hours per month to continue receiving health insurance. Starting on October 1, 2020, some beneficiaries who have received HMP coverage for more than 48 months prior to the implementation of the work requirements would have to pay a premium equal to 5 percent of their income.

Center for Civil Justice (CCJ) and the Michigan Poverty Law Program are seeking plaintiffs for a class action lawsuit in order to challenge these work requirements. Similar work requirements have already been struck down in several states, including Kentucky, Arkansas, and New Hampshire. By suing to prevent the implementation of these work requirements, we help to ensure that Michigan's HMP population remains covered. Specifically, we are looking for people who may be affected by this change to learn more about how we can help keep people covered. Specifically, we are looking for people who are:

Receiving Medicaid coverage through the Healthy Michigan Plan AND:

- ✓ Are Michigan residents;
- ✓ Are between the ages of 19 and 62;
- ✓ Have ongoing health needs:
- ✓ Have not been found to be disabled by Social Security or the State of Michigan;
- ✓ Anticipate having difficulty complying with the work requirements because of lack of access to transportation, seasonal employment, volatile hours, or struggle with employment due to background (education, criminal history, etc.)






