

Required Documentation for 2019 Christmas Assistance

- Current I.D. for <u>ALL adults</u> in the household (Michigan Driver's License, Michigan State I.D or current passport.) The last four digits of Social Security numbers are required for all household members.
- Proof of residence (Official Rental Agreement, Mortgage Statement)
- Proof of dependents in the home (Social Security cards AND one of the following required; birth certificates, school records, guardianship papers, insurance cards, updated shot records or mail with child's name on it)
- Proof of current household income (at or below 200% poverty level-see chart below)

Getting Rid of Gnats/Fruit Flies

House Cleaning Hacks

Stovetop Scrub

- Baking soda -Water

-Sprinkle baking soda over stains, sray water on baking soda -Soak for an hour then wipe clean

Create a small mixture of Apple Cider Vinegar and 3-4 drops of dish soap

 Pour left over wine into a jar (keep out of reach from children)

- Use 1 grapefruit - cut in half- cover it in salt -This method helps with stubborn stains

Steam Cleaning your **Microwave**

What you need: Microwave safe bowl 3-4 tablespoons of white vinegar - 1 cup of water Put it all in the bowl and microwave it for up to 4 minutes - wipe down with clean dish cloth

Bathtub Cleaning

- Mix 1/4 teaspoon of soap in cup of warm water

Wall Stains

 Use clean dish cloth or sponge to wipe walls, rinse with clean water and pat

dry

DIV Oven Cleaner

- Mix 4 tbsp of white vinegar, 5 tbsp of baking soda and 8 drops of dish soap - Spread over surface of oven, let sit 15 minutes then wipe with sponge
